Report re ^{12712?} 12073 Pte Kenney Jas, of "A" Co, 9th Yorks Regt, who died in or near this station on the morning of Wednesday Oct 14th 1915.

This patient was admitted to ADS. 70th Field Amb. at 9.15 Am. on above date.

When I saw him immediately after admission, he was already dead. Probably he had died at least some few minutes before admission.

He had a gunshot wound in the head, but as he was quite dead, I did not disturb the bandages.

He was aged 20 years, Religion R.C., Total service 1 1/2 years. Service in Field, 3/2 years.

His personal effects were returned to his unit.

I sent a written message to his O.C. stating that death had taken place, and requesting that arrangements should be made for removal of body. I requested that unit should remove the body, but had a visit of the adjutant of the 9th Yorks, and ultimately agreed to send my men to the cemetery with the body, there to hand it over to his own unit, and with instructions to return here immediately.

This was done, and I requested you to instruct me in regard to such a case, for future guidance.

I received your reply to-day.
